
EDITORIAL MIRROR

AFFIRMATION, ASPIRATION, AND PRAYER

It is up to each of us to look within, to find the place where something is singing, and to bring that song into action on all planes. Each of us must do it for ourselves, and by the act of doing we enrich everyone. Truth, in all its guises, shines like a beacon light from the heights of our aspirations, leading us on if we keep our eyes uplifted and ears open. It is our responsibility to make these connections. Dr. Dower once said, "Search for hidden causes in your own heart and the hearts of people and things. Stand on your own mental and soul feet and realize that no other can grow for you, no other can live for you, no other can eat for you. Try to realize unity with God — the Omnific Principle of Life and Love — now. To get acquainted with our real selves, the God within is, and should be, the divine purpose of life, and to that end all else should be subordinated. And when we do realize it — then we shall know what to do next — how to help the other fragments of our Greater Self to realize it — to point out as far as the Great Law will permit the true Path that winds uphill all the way and at the end of which is the Goal of Light and Life Eternal."

We have such richness of Masterly love, wisdom, and experience to draw from as we walk that true path, and yet they are simple steps. For example, affirmation, aspiration and prayer are steps that help us in the process of knowing ourselves, and as we know ourselves we begin to more deeply understand and love ourselves and others.

Let me examine these steps in light of our Temple Teachings. *Affirmation* is an act of positive assertion, of validation, and confirmation. *Aspiration* is more a desire to achieve something high or great, a feeling of ascending or soaring to heights indescribable,

a pledge of the very best within ourselves to the very highest we can imagine. *Prayer* is an act of petition, an entreaty or a request to God, to the Infinite Spirit, to All That Is, or to whatever we term the Universal Consciousness from which we came and in which we have our being. *Affirmation*, *Aspiration*, *Prayer*: all three are aspects of the same indwelling, upwelling search for unity with God, each having a little different aspect of this universal Truth. They are different, yet blurring as they approach each other, intermingling, and bearing with them our inmost essence.

We hear a lot about the power of affirmations and the material things we can manifest in our lives by simply affirming what we want. What isn't often mentioned in the popular press about the power of affirmation is that as we access the power of certain latent inner forces or elementals through our affirmation, we also set in motion the negative aspect of the force invoked. We probably do not have the training or the power to handle these pairs of opposites, but we gain that power and training by doing it and learning from the doing. After all, even the Masters of the highest degrees are still in training.

The process of labor and growth involves stepping back from ourselves to begin to consciously work on ourselves, as we separate the "big E" Ego from the physical body one tiny step at a time and merging the personal consciousness with that of the Absolute. This involves telling the noisy "little e" ego to be quiet and sit down while the real us is busy. Only at this height of evolution is it safe to call into action the unified forces of the "I Am" and direct them toward the accomplishment of a personal desire. The stumbling block below this height is personal desire, because even if we can justify a desire by assuring the universe that such desire is pure and undefiled, the fact remains that the element of self enters into the picture in some way, more and more subtly as we advance on The Path. The little "e" ego is very skilled in rationalization and justification. That we will gain this power over self is a given under the laws governing the evolution of consciousness. This power is gained "through the quiet, unostentatious movements of the slower process of normal growth." The following statement from Master Morya's writings is particularly helpful: "Knowledge for the mind, like food for the body, is intended to feed and help

to growth, but it requires to be well digested, and the more thoroughly and slowly the process is carried out the better, both for body and mind." We must remember there are no shortcuts.

We need to pay attention to the affirmations we make every day in a variety of ways. Our power comes in becoming more mindful. Sometimes the distinction between affirmation and prayer, both of which seem to be propelled by aspiration, becomes blurred.

For instance, let us consider the Consecration Hymn. We sing it frequently, usually struggling to sing that high F note with some degree of accuracy and wishing it could be in some other key. But how often do we pay single-focused, mindful attention to the words we are singing? "Holy Father, Only Son, Holy Spirit, three in One — Filled with trust we bow to Thee, Power and Force and Majesty." There is no doubt who or what we are addressing. There is no possible way that we can be separated from this Power, Force and Majesty. It is not outside of us; it is an interpenetrating, integral part of our being. Our responsibility is to consciously trust that Power, Force, and Majesty.


Next comes a simple, powerful affirmation that stops us in our tracks: "All we are or hope to be, here and now we offer Thee. Take and use it for Thy Child, sinless, pure and undefiled." Remember, we are that Child, each of us. We are speaking not to a God sitting on a throne, but to the three-fold aspect of all creation which is not outside of us, but interpenetrates every atom of the manifested universe. That Universal Spirit listens, accepts, records, and then holds us absolutely accountable for delivery. We make this promise every time we give voice to that song, and the thing that should thrill through our beings as we sing is the trust that the Universal Spirit has in us to be responsible for our choices and our commitments.

Remember the three R's: Respect for self, Respect for others, Responsibility for all our actions. We have so much help, so much Love, so much encouragement, and so much responsibility in this process of actually remembering that we are one with the Father.

Part of this responsibility is to give expression to the force of gratitude. This force is powerful, closely allied to the law of supply and demand. We need to set free this force of gratitude, or thankfulness, for the tremendous supply of everything we receive, all we have demanded of the Universe. The force of gratitude serves to complete the circuit. We are told, "Simply turn your thoughts inward to Omnipotent Love, and cultivate the will and desire for awakening this force within yourself, which, when cultivated, will flow forth as naturally as does desire for the accomplishment of wish or purpose." We have so much for which to be grateful.

In the Teachings of the Temple, Volume 1, Lesson 21 is entitled "Prayer." In it the Master says that we ask over and over that the governing laws of the Universe be changed in order that some personal desire be gratified, and often ask that the great law of Karma — cause and effect — be modified or changed in order that we may obtain some favor or win some power which we have not earned. He tells us we have no way of knowing of the problems, of the unspeakable anguish to us if we were allowed to do just as we desired, no matter how we dress up those desires. He goes on to say, "The strained, tense condition of the nerves from which countless thousands of people are now suffering is responsible for much of the evil that falls upon them. The same law that renders a relaxation of the body necessary is behind an equal necessity for soul relaxation, the law commonly known as gravitation, and true prayer should result in the relaxation of soul. The energy, which should be evenly distributed throughout all the nerves and muscles, is used up thoughtlessly or ignorantly in sustaining this tension, while for the time being it enables the ambitious man or woman to accomplish herculean tasks in business or pleasure; consequently, the body is robbed of necessary force, and the mind cannot function evenly and naturally; antagonism is engendered, and finally, incipient disease or decay manifests. You must learn to relax this tension by power of will, and I have already told you how you must evolve such willpower if you are to obtain it."

No one quarrels with that statement about the strained, tense condition of the nerves that much of humanity suffers from. Today we call it stress, and now are stressed about our stress! The statement that catches my eye is the last one, where He says we must learn to relax the tension by power of will, and that He has

already told us how we must evolve such willpower if we are to obtain it. *What? Did I miss something?* Read that over again, and again, and again! We get something — willpower — by evolving it and we already have been told how to do that.

Earlier in the lesson he said that anger, hatred, unbrotherly conduct, harsh criticism of others generates within our own auras a corroding, devitalizing form of force which not only results in illness of the physical body but also acts on the astral body and the organs of consciousness on the mind plane like a poison acts on the physical body in the physical world. If we are unvielding and unpliable we are broken on the wheel of the world; if we can be pliable we can bend beneath the storm, and the storm either passes over our heads and leaves us untouched or touches us so lightly by comparison that our rebound to a normal position is accomplished with very little difficulty when the danger is over. Those operational words of instruction seem to be that of evolving this willpower by practicing love, tolerance, acceptance and discipline of self. Trust in the evolutionary process is also an important element, as is balance. We are not being told that we are heavy with sin or guilt. Rather, we are trusted to listen, to take what we need at this time and use it wisely, and know that we are loved and to love without reservation in return.

Elsewhere in our Teachings there is a specific lesson about the

development of willpower, where it is pointed out that too often stubbornness and willpower are confused. How often will we claim to be full of willpower, but not claim any part of being stubborn? Those two words are *not* interchangeable. Stubbornness belongs to the mental plane and willpower to the spiritual. Willpower must be carefully cultivated in a systematic manner, and by the use of the mental faculties of decision and perseverance in accordance with Moral and Spiritual Law, to avoid falling into black magic.

With a great deal of love and understanding the Master sets forth several steps on cultivating willpower. After formulating in the mind an act to be willed, meditate carefully and then choose an act in accordance with your present power of accomplishment. For instance, you might choose to do some right thing from a right motive at the right time and place. Then decide on the time, methods, etc., to devote to that special act of the will. He tells us that one by one, as each difficulty comes up, set it aside, quietly but firmly. Rest assured that that noisy, wordy "little e" ego will fling a thousand and one difficulties our way. Keep the goal firmly in your mind's eye whenever it is possible, allow nothing derogatory to the purpose to influence you to stumble.

Each time you accomplish some task in this process, put it in the background and rest for at least twenty-four hours before setting yourself another one. Make each one a little more difficult, giving yourself plenty of time. Try to realize that the Will is a dynamic force of inconceivable power and requires guidance on all planes. It must be guided by Love and Wisdom. The Master's love shines forth when he tells us, "Remember, you probably have been working on this process in prior incarnations. If the Will is not under perfect control and guidance by the Ego, then you have the double job of bringing it under control and guiding its further development and growth. You can do it. Don't be discouraged, for nothing can harm you more, nothing can so nullify your every effort. If Karma has placed you under restrictions, do all you conscientiously can in every direction, and rest secure in the knowledge that when the debt has been paid, the way will be opened wide before you." You can do this.

The lesson called *Prayer* also contains these instructions: "If

from the higher point of renunciation, the soul, while in a perfect state of relaxation sends forth a prayer to the Infinite — not for some personal favor, but of faith, of love for that Infinite — the same law which compels one pole of electricity to respond to the other will compel a response from the Infinite Domains, and the response will be in accordance with the real needs of the aspiring soul. You will frequently find that the surest way of winning a thing is to give up even the desire for that thing." Notice that the response we will get to our prayer is "...in accordance with the real needs of our aspiring soul." That which is comfortable and heads our list of personal wants is often widely divergent from that which is our real need. This is hard to remember when the going really gets tough, that the seeming difficulties are often just what we *need* from the standpoint of our aspirations. Not getting what we want is sometimes a stroke of luck. The burning of the dross from our lower natures is never comfortable, but it is the thing our Real Self is working on whether we like it or not. As we begin to understand this, we can more easily move from the plane of the personality onto the plane of forces for a clearer view of our needs, rather than our wants. The paradox is that, as the process goes on with our conscious cooperation, we begin to want what we truly need rather than seeming to need what we want.

The lesson finishes with these words: "The wisdom of the ages is compressed in the words spoken by Jesus, 'Not my will but Thine be done.' Only when prayer is preceded by that sentence, winged by an unselfish love that asks only to love, not for love, that Omnipotence can answer. The highest power is commonly won by renunciation. Renounce with thy whole heart, love with thy whole heart, work with thy whole heart, and all things in heaven and earth are thine." But we had better be careful what we ask for, because at this stage of our evolution, we may not be prepared to receive it! We must remember to pray, understanding that there is immeasurable power in prayer. We can make every minute of every day an unceasing prayer, and still be actively functioning on the physical plane.

Affirmation, Aspiration, and Prayer...how do we translate these into action in today's world? Under the tremendous pressures of the present time, we cannot live a completely contemplative or

secluded life, nor is it necessary. We must interact with each other and with ourselves. This is how we learn. As we do so in the light of the Temple Teachings we find another dimension of life, with a depth and color that deepens and unfolds as our consciousness reaches within and without, touching all the other aspects of the Divine. Most of us get such a high when we are tuned into the right keynote that we want to shout it from the housetops. The real test is to put it into daily, hourly use without saying a word, without being self-righteous in thought or deed, simply letting it shine from our beings.

Part of our work is learning to recognize that we are already practicing many of these things to some degree. We need to acknowledge our own worth, our own connection with God, in order to proceed with the fine-tuning, adjusting, and balancing that are necessary before taking the next step. We often speak of the necessity of *being* the thing we believe in. We can only *be* one tiny step at a time. But as a wise elder used to say, "The only way to eat an elephant is one bite at a time." Sometimes that step of *being* is faltering and hesitant, but at other times it is confident and sure, as we gain confidence in ourselves.

We must continue to look with honesty, wonder and love at our strengths, our weaknesses, our courage, our fortitude, and our true Brother/Sisterhood in every part of the manifested and unmanifested Universe. It is a wakeup call to break the bindings of our lower selves and take the next step on the Path toward our conscious reunion with the Divine.

This call is expressed in the powerful affirmation of our highest Aspiration: *I will endeavor to realise the presence of the Avatar as a living power in my life.* So Be It.

As indestructible as life itself;


These are the deeds of loving kindliness,

PRAYER

"The whole purpose of prayer is to unify myself with God, the Creative Spirit."

Is there anything more wonderful than this statement by James Dillet Freeman, poet and Unity minister? But how do we do this? How do we unify ourselves with God? From my perspective, this is a process that begins with finding the place of peace within ourselves.

Many years ago, during informal discussion sessions held here in Halcyon, a point was made that gratitude is one of the highest forms of prayer. That little seed that was planted in me took hold and started to grow. I began to look at each and every thing as a gift from God, taking nothing for granted. I started compiling lists of the things I am grateful for.

It was difficult at first, but once the pencil hit the paper, things began to pour out. I still have these lists and look at them frequently. On one of the first lists made early one morning, I was profoundly grateful for hot water, shaving cream, and a sharp razor. I soon discovered we can't be grateful and unhappy at the same time.

In a publication called *The Daily Word*, I once read this: "The more we pray, the more we experience God's grace — not because grace is something we must request or earn. Our prayers keep us focused on, and receptive to, all the blessings that our loving Creator is pouring out to us. The inspiration we receive during our times of sacred communion opens us to the truth of God's grace."

From an inner vision, we understand that we are living each day by the grace of God. We understand that the love and mercy of God's grace are not withheld from us in our current circumstances and will not be absent in our future ones. God's grace has cleared many obstacles in our way so that we can move forward.

Historically, there are two types of prayer: Conventional and affirmative. In conventional or theistic prayer, one reaches out to God and prays to make contact. The eternal question is, "Why wasn't my prayer answered?" Numerous clichés result

from this cry for help, such as "It is God's will," or "God is punishing you for your sins." As long as people view God as Santa Claus, making a list of those who are naughty and nice, the results of prayer will be unanswered and continue to create confusion that spirals into disillusionment.

With affirmative prayer, we continuously affirm the truth for ourselves by using powerful statements such as "I am one with God and All Good, Evil has no power over me." In this statement we affirm our relationship with God, just as Jesus affirmed this very truth not only for Himself but also for others. We find throughout history that this affirmative approach has been obscured because early translators had no concept of the "I am" statement and therefore could not translate it. Thus most of these statements are made into supplications and petitions.

Look at The Lord's Prayer. In the traditional sense, it is a prayer of petition; however, when viewed in the more current approach using the affirmative statement, we see The Lord's Prayer written as follows:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed is your name. Your kingdom is now coming forth. Your will is always being done in earth as it is in Heaven. You give us this day our daily bread. You always forgive us as we forgive. You would never lead us into temptation, but are the very power of deliverance from limitation. For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory for ever. Amen.

Affirmative prayer is the highest form of creative thought. It includes the release of counterproductive thoughts as well as holding in mind statements of spiritual truths. Through prayer and meditation, we experience the presence of God. Both prayer and meditation heighten our awareness and thereby transform our lives. We pray *with* our consciousness, not to escape *from* it. The goal is to align our consciousness with an affirmative thought and focus deeply on it for a period of time.

What then is the best way to pray? As we move towards living in a state of Grace and begin to identify with that state, we recognize how that state gives deeper meaning to our lives and how our lives can be re-created each and every moment. It's not necessary to be a boat on the water without compass or

rudder. We can take hold of the tiller that steers our lives and with that instrumentation chart our own course.

According to James Dillet Freeman, "When we begin to form a consciousness of the presence of God, whose good pleasure it is to give us the Kingdom, we realize that prayer is not conquering God's reluctance. It is synchronizing ourselves in consciousness with the cosmic flow, which is God's eternal willingness." When we pray we do not speak the words to make them true any more than we state a chemical equation to make it so. Nature has created it to be so. Truth is true even before we affirm it. We affirm the truth as we believe it, not to get a response from God, but to synchronize with the Higher Self.

May healing action do its work and aid you in becoming one with God and All Good.
