The theme of our Convention is "Gratitude and obedience, unshaken by the Law of Creation" and I thought that this is the key to that inner freedom that our soul craves, and that this is the indication of the direction in which the disciple goes, striving for the Light.

Often the word "obedience" causes in us an inner protest, being perceived as an infringement of the personality. But obedience is not blind submission, but rather an act of supreme trust. This is the very "school of the heart" where the disciple, throwing off the husk of his "I," learns to hear the music of the Cosmic Will.

As a musician submits his fingers to the strict laws of harmony in order to extract a divine sound, so the seeking spirit submits his self-will to the Highest Law in order to become a tool of the Light.

This is the discipline of the soul; this is the Path of Service and a stage of deep inner work.

Obedience is not a limitation of freedom, but a fundamental basis for the transfer of accumulated wisdom and protection from repeating mistakes.

It is necessary to recognize those who are above, and in joy to follow them, for in this recognition is our own ascent.

If obedience is a discipline, then gratitude is a living flame of the heart.

Remember Prometheus; he carried not just physical fire, but spiritual power, knowledge and hope, which transform a person and give him the opportunity to overcome ignorance and darkness.

How often we forget that gratitude is not just a form of politeness, but a powerful high energy! It can also be said that gratitude is a purifier of the heart. It washes it with dust, making it light, like a bird ready to fly.

Gratitude is also a sister of devotion, which does not ask for anything in return, but itself becomes a source of warmth. Ingratitude is like a desert, where the best accumulations of the spirit are extinguished. Is it possible to go to the Light without feeling the warmth of the hands extended to us from the Higher Realms?

When the heart is filled with gratitude, obedience ceases to be an effort. It becomes natural, like the beating of the heart, and we begin to understand that every Instruction is not an order, but a gentle help.

Dear friends, We warmly greet all participants in the Convention.

Our Israeli Society of Living Ethics has long maintained a close and enduring connection with the Temple Teachings. This connection began with the first books published in Russian more than thirty years ago, which we studied with great care alongside Theosophy and the Teaching of Agni Yoga.

Yet even earlier, Yevgenia Benderskaya, the founder of our Society, had received a small, beautifully produced book in English, published by the Temple at the beginning of the twentieth century.

The theme of this Convention is very close to our hearts, for the importance of these qualities is more evident today than ever before. Without them, it is impossible to become a disciple of a spiritual Teaching — or even to approach the energies of the New Era.

In my understanding, another concept closely related to obedience is humility. Obedience and humility carry kindred meanings.

The root of the Russian word *smirenie*, meaning humility, is *mir* — peace. When we attain inner peace and stillness, we become capable of hearing both the earthly teacher and the Heavenly Teacher, and of comprehending the meaning of life.

In the Teaching of Agni Yoga, these qualities are indeed closely connected. They are understood not as passivity or humiliation, but as manifestations of conscious spiritual strength:

Gratitude purifies and opens the heart.

Humility subdues the ego-self and the lower nature.

Obedience brings human free will into harmony with the Higher Will.

Let us consider them in turn.

Gratitude

Gratitude is not merely a moral sentiment; it is a real fiery energy capable of purifying the human being, strengthening our bonds with other people and with the world, and accelerating the refinement of our own nature.

“Great is the healing power of the emission of gratitude.”

— Agni Yoga, §31

“Gratitude is a great motive force.”

— Aum, §454

Let us again turn to the roots of this word in the Russian language, for the Teaching of Agni Yoga was given in Russian. The word *blagodarnost*, gratitude, unites *blago* — goodness or blessing — and *dar* — a gift.

Thus, the word itself already implies spiritual energy and an open heart in which this energy may abide. It also implies the ability to direct one’s consciousness toward another person and their circumstances, so as to understand and appreciate an action or a gift of talent, and to give thanks.

Gratitude is also the capacity to give the energy of one’s heart — to bestow good upon those around us. It is likewise the ability to send this heart-energy of gratitude to the Teacher.

This heart-energy sustains the living bond of the Silver Thread. Without the energy and the thought of gratitude, this bond receives no nourishment and may eventually be broken.

This is why gratitude is so important, both for the individual and as a foundation for communication within a family and for cooperation in every sphere of life.

A grateful spirit more readily receives new and higher energies. It preserves and strengthens its bond with Hierarchy, making it easier for the worlds to draw closer together.

Obedience

Every process of learning is built upon obedience: to listen, to repeat, to come to know, and finally to apply independently. These are the stages of learning.

In Russian, the word *poslushanie*, obedience, is rooted in the verb *slushat* — to listen. The ability to listen means setting aside, for a time, one's personal and already established knowledge, so that something new may be received, understood, and mastered.

It also means consciously accepting the Guidance of Hierarchy — Guidance founded upon love, trust, discernment, and free choice.

“Complete obedience to the indications and the precise execution of them gives health and leads to great victory, to great Light.”

— Helena Roerich, letter of January 7, 1931

Helena Ivanovna Roerich also wrote:

“Obedience and the curbing of one's own self-will will be the first step toward self-discipline.”

— Helena Roerich, letter of January 7, 1931

Therefore, true obedience is possible only where free will exists.

It is not the renunciation of free thought or independent inquiry. It is the renunciation of self-will — and its result is the assumption of responsibility.

A person accepts Higher Guidance, but must also exercise discernment, initiative, and independence, and carry out what has been entrusted with the highest possible quality.

Humility

Within this understanding of obedience, I return to humility as one of its facets — a facet through which self-renunciation and selflessness are revealed.

We must distinguish between an affected display of humility, which may conceal pride, and true humility:

“For only self-denial and self-sacrifice can give understanding of humility.”

— Fiery World III, §24

True humility is not passive submission to outward circumstances, but the inner power to overcome them and triumph over them.

Thus, it is not the human spirit that is humbled, but the ego-self: self-will, astral desires, pride, and the lower sheaths.

True humility is the power of the spirit over oneself.

It does not bow before evil, yet it can accept a trial without complaint and pass through it courageously.

Conclusion

All these qualities, whose true nature is the energy of Light, neutralize egoism and selfhood within us. They purify us, strengthen the will, and make us capable of conscious Service.

These words deeply resonate with my understanding that gratitude is a way of recognizing the Divine Presence in every circumstance.

For me, **gratitude and obedience** cannot exist separately. **Obedience** without gratitude becomes mere duty, while **gratitude** without obedience remains only a feeling.

Together, they become a living path of faith, humility, joyful service, and conscious cooperation with the **Creative Law**, leading us toward deeper union with **God and All Good**.

Our understanding of the conference theme:

Why are gratitude and obedience so important, and why are they a necessary part of the Law of Creation?

Gratitude is the feedback loop between the Source and the human being.

Since all energy that creates worlds descends from the Higher Source, gratitude is the magnet that maintains the connection between a person and the Higher Forces.

When a person remembers the Source, the flow remains pure.

When he or she forgets, the flow becomes distorted and often leads to the loss of orientation, self-centeredness, and pride.

Without gratitude, any act of creation can become unstable.

Gratitude is the law of circulation: energy comes, is used, and ends with gratitude. This closes the circle.

Gratitude is the mechanism of connection between the Source and the form.

What it does in creation:

- Maintains the connection with the Source; purifies intention.
- Makes energy stable; prevents power from becoming personal property. This represents the vertical axis of creation.

Without it, the form cannot be filled.

Obedience

Obedience is the acceptance of everything sent by Karma or the Higher Forces.

Obedience is not weakness or lack of will; it is the ability to hear and understand that what comes is ultimately for our benefit.

Why is it essential? Because creation is not only energy, it is also timing.

Everything is born — in a specific rhythm, in a specific cycle, in a specific phase of space.

Obedience is the ability to: act at the right moment; not act prematurely; not go against the rhythm.

What happens without obedience?

If obedience is absent, action occurs at the wrong moment

The form breaks; energy is wasted; the person goes against evolution; creation becomes chaotic.

Obedience is the mechanism of alignment with the rhythm of time.

What Obedience Does in Creation

Obedience aligns action with rhythm, makes the form stable, allows energy to enter correctly, prevents destruction.

Thus, obedience is the mechanism of the precise moment.

Why are these two laws the foundation of creation?

Because they create a double axis: vertical (energy) — horizontal (rhythm).

Gratitude is the pure source of energy, and obedience is the correct understanding of the Higher Law.

Without gratitude and obedience, the mission does not unfold

Energy cannot be held; creation does not occur; the person loses connection with the Source.

With them, the channel to the Higher opens. Direction comes.

Strength appears, harmony arises, creation becomes possible.

Gratitude holds the Source.

Obedience holds the direction.

Together they create the possibility of creation.

The very structure of creation is arranged so that without these two functions, energy cannot be held, form cannot be born, and the intention cannot be fulfilled.

Why are they connected with the mission of Unity?

Unity is the result, while gratitude and obedience are the necessary conditions. Gratitude connects with the Source. Obedience connects with the rhythm. Unity connects people and space.

I would say that I have a complex relationship with the concepts of gratitude and obedience, and I would offer that I am probably not unique in this. People raised in the United States are taught the values of self reliance and individualism. We are told that success in life is measured by how far you rise above your inherited circumstances through your own initiative. Yes, we are asked to be obedient to the law and grateful to each other on Thanksgiving, but for the most part these values lag far behind those that emphasize independence.

After all, the country began with a Declaration of Independence that told us we were free from the bounds of obedience to monarchy, and regardless of how the systems of power have reasserted themselves over the course of time and have, in many ways, restored us to a state of servitude, we are still taught to think of ourselves not as a collective but as revolutionary individualists.

But when invited to think about gratitude and obedience, we can begin to question these assumptions. A common trait of these two concepts is that they both imply a giver and a receiver. We offer gratitude and obedience *to* something, so already, in contrast to the actions of the individual ego, we are working within the bounds of a relationship. Moreover, we can think about what or whom might be the object these concepts point to. We might be repulsed by the notion of offering gratitude and obedience to an earthly power, but we may have the opposite reaction if the object is the collective of humanity, life itself, the Masters, the Higher Law, or perhaps all of these taken together.

By this definition, I feel gratitude for the gift of life itself, for the opportunity to be of service, for the many people and forces that have helped me, and for realizing the opportunity to be on the Path, not as a lone individual but as one of many working toward a state of Unity with all. I would suggest that obedience in that light becomes very easy. Rather than thinking of obedience as a relinquishment of one's will out of fear or weakness, we can think of obedience to the All as a natural outcome of the understanding that also sparks our gratitude. Obedience is, in other words, just an acknowledgement of our alignment with the Higher Self, not as a separate power that dominates us but as our own center point and inheritance.

"Gratitude and Obedience, both inviolable to the Creative Law" is an important theme.

Every day we read: "Help us respond daily with Gratitude and Obedience, unwavering to the Law of the Universe, which from transcendent heights illuminates the dark depths of our own creation."

In Kabbalah, these concepts are associated with the main process—the transition from the "desire to receive" (egoism) to the "desire to give" (altruism). Gratitude as similarity to the Creator.
